Dream Networks CIC partners with Artificial Intelligence as a participatory tool to support and enhance our mission to create Play4All. We do not engage with AI as a replacement for human judgment, lived experience, or community knowledge.

When working with children, communities and businesses, we apply the following seven principles when using AI:

Human-led



Children, caregivers, and communities remain the authors of ideas and decisions. AI is used only to support exploration, visualisation, and learning.

Safeguarding first



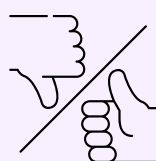
We do not use AI systems that require children to share personal or identifiable data. We avoid biometric, behavioural profiling, or surveillance-based tools.

Consent and Understanding



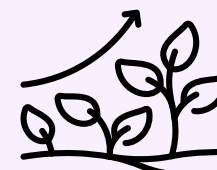
Participants are informed in age-appropriate ways, when AI tools are being used and what they are (and are not) doing.

Bias-aware and context-sensitive



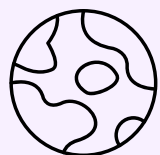
We recognise that AI systems can reproduce racial, gendered, colonial and economic bias. Our outputs are always reviewed, adapted, and grounded in local cultural and environmental contexts.

Non-extractive practice



Community ideas, images, and stories are not used to train proprietary AI systems without consent, acknowledgement, and clear benefit to participants. Our practises seek to develop local skills and resources through the use of AI.

Planet conscious



We use AI intentionally to reduce our carbon footprint by favouring low-energy, efficient use and replacing carbon-intensive activities wherever possible.

Playful, critical engagement



AI is treated as something to question, experiment with, and to learn about.
